These classes are ideal for divorcing, separating or never married couples. They are also helpful for those interested in improving personal skills, and growing as a parent. Classes are intended to focus on your children so that you can help them successfully transition during your divorce or separation.

The Court hopes that by taking these classes parents will learn skills to avoid common mistakes in an effort to work together with their co-parent for the sake of their children.

1 Register Online
